DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

(Carl R. Beardsley, Jr., Executive Director)

Executive Director Carl Beardsley reported passenger boardings saw a <u>5.5%</u> increase in January 2020 when compared to January 2019, making January 2020 the highest enplanements for the month of January on record.

Load factor, on average, was at 78%. Interestingly, load factors for both American Airlines and United Airlines are both holding at an extremely respectable 81% load factor. This tells us the community is supporting all the westbound flights we have. General Aviation saw a 37.4% increase, or 247 additional flights coming in to our FBO.

We are seeing an increase of 26% for Uber and Lyft pick-ups at AVP, and 737 people have joined our new Loyalty Program. Many of our customers come from Lackawanna and Luzerne Counties, however we are also

seeing customers from Bradford and Susquehanna Counties as well as Broome County in the southern tier of New York.

AGREEMENTS:

A. Land Lease Agreement with Aviation Technologies, Inc.

Recommend the Airport Board approve a land lease agreement between Aviation Technologies, Inc. and the Bi-County Airport Board dba the Wilkes-Barre Scranton International Airport. The dimensions of the parcel under lease is 18,000 square feet. This land will be used as home for a new hangar facility used to store aircraft. The parcel is located on the Southern General Aviation Ramp where other hangars are located, for example, the PA State Police helicopter facility.

Recently, Aviation Technologies has had to turn aircraft away due to a lack of vacant space for new aircraft. The land lease goes into effect February 27, 2020. The per square foot rate for the hangar is expected to be .135 which is in line with Federal Aviation Administration Fair Market Requirements. Finally, this Agreement defines the rules and regulations of operating at an airport that must be followed by the Lessor throughout their term.

Lessee shall pay to Lessor in equal monthly installments in advance on the first day of each calendar month during the Term annual fixed rent in the amount equal to \$1.20 per square foot of the Property and Improvements (the "Annual Fixed Rent"). In addition, Lessee shall pay to the Lessor a Common Area Maintenance Fee at a rate of \$0.135 per square foot of the Property and Improvements.

The Agreement will be between The Hertz Corporation, a Delaware corporation, and its wholly owned subsidiary, DTG Operations, Inc., Avis Rent A Car System, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, Budget Rent A Car System, Inc., a Delaware corporation, ELRAC, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, d/b/a Enterprise Rent-A-Car, Alamo Rent A Car, National Car Rental, and the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport.

The Airport, as Option Grantor, has entered into an assignable agreement for exclusive option to lease and develop at the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton

International Airport. And dated February 27th, 2020 with the RAC's providing the RAC's the opportunity to have a consultant perform certain feasibility services and, subject to acceptance and election to proceed, design development and pricing services with respect to the following possible project and the option to lease the property on the airport.

D. Union Agreement

Recommend the Airport Board approve the Agreement between the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport and Laborers' Int'l Union of North America Local 13-10. Agreement is for five years from January 27, 2020 to January 26, 2025. Key changes to the labor agreement made under the new Agreement:

PERSONNEL - Cont'd...

- Employees will receive increases in their hourly wages ranging from 2% to 2 ½%/yr for each of the 5 years of the Contract (2020 2024), cumulatively totaling 11.9% over the 5 years (average 2.37%/yr).
- Health care contributions, currently 6% for individual and twoperson coverage and 6½% for family coverage, increases universally (all tiers) to 13% of premium cost in 2020 and graduates to 15% by the last year of the Contract (2024).
- Earned sick leave, currently 1 day/month (12 max/yr) is reduced immediately to 2/3 day earned/month (8 days max/yr) for new hires and remains at that level. Current employees are grandfathered at 12 days/yr for the term of this Agreement.
- Employees who achieve 25 years of service will receive one (1) paid personal day as a Service Award.

A. <u>Financial Report.</u>

(1) Revenue - Expense Report.

As noted on the attached profit/loss statements, for the month of January 2020, Airport Operations had a net income totaling \$77,174.00 compared to a net loss of \$52,542.00 in January 2019, which is a difference of \$129,716.00.

Significant variations for those are: Landing revenue is up \$9,547.00; Terminal revenue is up \$4,581.00; Parking revenue is up \$60,850.00; Administrative expenses are down \$28,852.00 due to non-reoccurring expenses (of website upgrade in 2019, Security closed caption servicing and legal expenses); and Garage and Shop expenses have decreased \$12,273.00 because of good weather conditions/less snow removal purchases.

Invoices received since the last meeting for supplies and services totaling \$733,678.52 are presented on the attached sheets for review and approval of the Board. These invoices include major construction project costs of \$430,719.06.

ENGINEERING REPORT:

(Steve Mykulyn, P.E., Director of Engineering)

A. Change Order - ACP 14-03 Parking Garage Rehabilitation

Recommend the Airport Board approve Change Order No. 1, increasing our contract with Krisha Construction, Inc., \$301,614.00 from \$634,000.00 to \$935,614.00, subject to PennDOT and solicitor's concurrence. This change order extends the scope of work to include replacement of deteriorated Fire Protection Piping and to provide a protective coating of traffic bearing membrane to the entire roof level of the garage. This expansion of the scope is being funded with the remaining funds in the State Grant for which we will provide a 50% match.

DISCUSSION: Mr. McGinley asked Mr. Mykulyn if this was something that came up

during the course of the project. Mr. Mykulyn replied that when the project was originally bid, the bids came in well under what was anticipated. One of the recommendations in the original scope of the project was to include a membrane coating for the entire roof level, but it was felt that we did not have the funds based on estimates. Since there were funds remaining, we are able to incorporate this work and prolong the life of the garage. With regard to the sprinkler piping, this was not part of the original scope, however, we discovered issues with system holding pressure in the sprinkler piping after the work was started and since it was technically rehabilitation, it fell under the parameters of the grant so we incorporated that into the project as well, rather than seek

other sources.

In an effort to satisfy the financial requirements dictated by the bank, Aviation Technologies, Inc. has requested that AVP extend the FBO agreement to make it concurrent with the schedule associated with the new hangar.

The Airport requests that the Bi-County Airport Board authorize the term of the FBO agreement be extended until 2038.
