A. Financial Report.

As noted on the attached profit/loss statements, for the month of March 2021, Airport Operations had a net loss totaling \$303,719 compared to a net loss of \$26,952 in March 2020, which is a difference of \$276,767. Year-To-Date 2021, Airport Operations had a net loss totaling \$1,019,273, as compared to an income of \$142,270 in 2020, which is a difference of \$1,161,543.

A. Bid Award

ACP 18-03 Taxiway B Extension Phase II - Localizer Site Preparation and Air Traffic Control Tower (ATCT) Access Road

Bids for Construction of the "Taxiway B Extension Phase II - Localizer Site Preparation and Air Traffic Control Tower (ATCT) Access Road" Project were opened on Thursday, April 15, 2021 at 2:00 P.M. in the Airport Board Room by Administration and Lackawanna County Deputy Controller, Germaine Helcoski. A total of five bid packages were received and opened. After review and tabulation of the bids, the Design Consultant for the project, McFarland Johnson, Inc., provided a recommendation as to award. MJ recommended award of the Contract in the amount of \$4,600,765.00 to the low bidder, JBS Dirt, Inc., (see attached). Bid tabulation is provided below:

My. Mykulyn noted that in general, it appears the JBS made a concerted effort to get the award. Atty. Frederickson asked if they posted a required bid bond. My. Mykulyn answered that they did post a 5% Bid Bond. Mr. McGinley commented that it is the lowest bid and Steve has assured that it meets all the specifications. It surely appears that they want the work and they came through with a good bid number and we're

fortunate to have that this time.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Executive Director Carl Beardsley reported a summary of passenger boardings, seat availability and load factors for March 2021.

Passenger boardings for the month of March were up 2.2%. Although it's not a huge number, it's a move in the right direction. American and United both shared in the increase with 37.1% and 20% increases, respectfully.

Although seat availability was down 39%, load factors are holding at a very impressive 77.2% average. General Aviation also saw a dramatic increase of operations to 75.4% as compared to March 2020.

Mr. McGinley noted the numbers are so much better given the fact that Delta is not currently flying from AVP. Those customers are clearly now using the American and United service and we are hopeful this positive trend continues.
