secure either a new carrier to come to our market or an incumbent airline to expand their service at AVP. The airlines are starting to shake the pandemic is all their markets, so it's going to take some time to get new service. New airlines like Breeze have focused on larger airports right now; the smallest being Huntsville, AL. To answer the question, it is AVP's goal 100% to go after additional service. Although he couldn't give exact dates of when that might happen, Mr. Beardsley assured the

audience that AVP is aggressively working on adding service.

Mr. McGinley added that AVP is always looking at adding air service.

Executive Director Carl Beardsley reported a summary of passenger boardings, seat availability and load factors for April 2021.

Passenger boardings for the month of April were up 798.3% (average). American Airlines saw an increase of 698.4% and United increased with 3857.6%. Although the boardings are not what we saw pre-pandemic, it's certainly very positive growth which we hope will continue.

Seat availability was increased by 26% overall and load factors for April 2021 were at a very impressive 89.8% average. General Aviation also saw a dramatic increase of operations: 575 more operations when compared to April 2020.
