AGREEMENTS:

The majority of commercial service airports in the United States offer an incentive program designed to attract new airlines to offer new service from these airports. Normally, this type of incentive program includes a combination of landing fee waivers, rent, common use, terminal fee waivers and marketing for up to two years. These elements combine to help offset the financial risk the airlines encounter when offering new service and help mitigate losses during the start-up phase of service at an airport.

Additional passenger traffic at the airport translates to higher local employment and economic impact.

The Airport is requesting approval from the Airport Board to implement an air service incentive program for entice new airline service.

COMMENT: Mr. Chermak added there is possible grant money to offset these costs.

Mr. Beardsley affirmed there is a grant called the Small Community Service Development Grant which we would use, if awarded, to entice airlines with the possibility of providing service here at AVP. Mr. Notarianni also commented that this program is done industry wide.

A. ARFF Supervisor

Todd Kuna is currently a Lead Fireman in the at the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport. His role includes leading the Rescue Team's responses to to airport emergencies and medical incidents, and serving as lead incident command.

In an effort to strengthen our Rescue, Fire Fighting and Emergency Response functions, which by federal regulations are increasingly more complex, we propose to expand Todd's role by promoting him to ARFF (Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting) Supervisor. We propose to promote Todd as the Supervisor of the Airport's Fire Fighting, Emergency and Rescue services, as well as continue and actually, amplify his current lead roles under the FAA's Emergency Plan and the Airport's Certification Manual. He will be paid on a salary (no longer hourly) basis and will, as required, exit

the bargaining unit (Union). His annual salary will be adjusted from \$43,305.00 annually to \$46,305.00.

B. Lead Mechanic

Mike Sobolewski has been with the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport for 34 years, is classified as a Mechanic, a significant role that includes repairing all airport fleet vehicles (approx. 27 active vehicles in service at any time). During his time here Mike's work record has been excellent if not outstanding. He is recognized by Management as well as his peers as the lead person in our Maintenance Garage, and is our go-to person when we have critical issues with our fleet, ranging from random truck or auto issues to snow removal equipment that breaks down while on duty in emergency conditions. If there is any chance for in-house repair for these vehicles, thereby saving the Airport a great deal of money, Mike is our guy.

We think it is appropriate to finally recognize him for his unofficial role as our lead mechanic by officially changing his title to Lead Mechanic, and in turn, adjusting his wages by the same \$1.75/hr that is applicable to the Acting Supervisor rate. As the Lead Mechanic, he will continue to be in the bargaining unit (Union).

We ask that the Airport Board approve Mike's proposed title change and corresponding wage adjustment.

B. Construction Change Directive No.1 - Taxiway B Extension - Localizer Site Preparation, ATCT Access Road (ACP 18-03)

Recommend the Airport Board approve Construction Change Directive No. 1, increasing our contract with JBS Dirt, Inc., \$72,320.00 from \$4,600,765.00 to \$4,673,085.00, subject to FAA and solicitor's concurrence.

<u>Item #1</u>. This directive ads a pay item to the contract for Undercut Excavation and Disposal. The addition is for the removal and disposal of unsuitable soils found during the stripping of the existing ground for construction of Alt#1 embankment. The existing soils contained organics, logs, woody debris, and unstable soils. The Geotechnical Engineer found these to be an unsuitable foundation for construction of the embankment and directed removal.

<u>Item#2</u>. This directive ads a pay item to the contract for soils stripped in the area of borrow pit #2 that were found to contain asphalt and organics and was unsuitable for use as fill. The material was disposed of onsite at a designated disposal location.

We ask the Board to authorize the approval of this Construction Change Directive.

After review and tabulation of the bids, the Design Consultant for the project, McFarland Johnson, Inc., provided a recommendation as to award. MJ recommended award of the Contract (Base Bid Alternate 3) in the amount of \$6,998,000.00 to the low bidder, Leeward Construction, Inc., Honesdale, PA (see attached recommendation). All permits are in hand for the wetland mitigation and the stream crossing. The Contractor has requested a suspension of the work for a three-week period as we wait for more suitable ground conditions in the access road corridor and for the delivery of the concrete box culvert for the stream crossing.

Bids were opened for the Taxiway B Site Preparation construction project on March 17th and award of bid and approval of the Construction Monitoring Agreement were sought at today's meeting. Grant application to the FAA for the project will be made in next two weeks.

COMMENTS:

Assistant Director Gary Borthwick responded to Controller Griffiths question during Public Comment: We (Finance/ Administration) pursue all overdue invoices either through traditional means, i.e., sending out past due/late notices, phone calls and emails. If they do not respond they get suspension notices. We have had several customers in Hangars that are were in arrears, and taken their planes out of the hangars and placed them in the field. We are reluctant to write things off as bad debt, but in Donald Trump's case, we may have to as we have reached out to the RNC and his campaign to no avail. Many of the items you'll see in the 30-day column, are paid as this report is as of 2/28/22, especially as it relates to the Airlines.

ITEM 7 DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

(Carl R. Beardsley, Jr., Executive Director)

Mr. Beardsley reported a 67.3% increase of enplanements when comparing February 2022 to February 2021. Seat availability also increased by 36.2%: mainly due to the new American Mainline jets now servicing AVP. Load factors for the month of February 2022, is up 17.8% to an incredible 92.5%. These numbers tell the Airlines, the community is supporting the service, and makes for a good discussion to increase service here at AVP. General Aviation also saw an increase of 9.2% in February 2022.

A. <u>Sunflower Program</u>

Mr. Beardsley asked Executive Assistant Eve Hennigan to report to the Board about a new program at AVP to assist people with disabilities: The Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Program.

Ms. Hennigan explained how this program helps to show AVP's commitment to working with people in the community that have disabilities. Since most disabilities are "invisible" the Sunflower Lanyard Program enables someone with a disability to choose to be discreetly visible so that support, assistance or just a little more time and

kindness can be given. The AVP staff will be trained in the next few weeks and the program will be fully operational in April.

Mr. Beardsley reported AVP Airport Staff and Tenants recently participated in St. Patrick's Day Parades in Pittston, Scranton and Wilkes-Barre. It was a great opportunity to engage with the community.

D. Greater Scranton Chamber of Commerce Presentation

Mr. Beardsley reported he recently made a presentation at a recent Scranton Chamber of Commerce meeting to local business leaders with regard to present and future visions at AVP.
