<u>ITEM 5</u> <u>ENGINEERING REPORT:</u> (Stephen Mykulyn, P.E., Director of Engineering)

A. Contracts:

ACP 18-03, Taxiway B Extension (Runway 4 Approach End)

Recommend the Airport Board approve the attached Amendment to the Non-Federal Reimbursable Agreement between the Department of Transportation – Federal Aviation Administration and Luzerne and Lackawanna Counties, Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport, for FAA Construction/Installation Support, Flight Check and Equipment Procurement to Relocate the Runway 22 (IZK) Localizer at Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport (AVP), Avoca, PA.

The purpose of this Amendment (AJW-FN-ESA-20-NE-3545-A1) is to add scope and cost to the existing agreement for addition of a new FAA access gate on the relocated Lidy Road. FAA Engineering Services will collaborate with Sponsor's national security contractor to design and install the new gate. FAA will perform design review of plans for the gate and development of a cost estimate development for FAA activities related to installation of the new gate.

The Airport anticipates a second amendment after design completion has established the cost of the work to be performed. Once that amendment is issued, grant application will be made through the FAA Bi-partisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and PA DOT Bureau of Aviation. This FAA grant will cover 90% of the agreement costs with 5% State and 5% PFC funds covering the remaining portions. The agreement amount, for this phase, not to exceed \$55,363.56.

After review and tabulation of the bids, the Design Consultant for the project, KBA Engineering p.c., provided a recommendation as to award. KBA recommended award of the Contract in the amount of \$1,663,200.00 to the low bidder, American Asphalt Paving Corporation, Shavertown, PA (see attached recommendation). Bid tabulation is attached.

Recommend the Airport Board award the Project to American Asphalt Paving, and authorize Airport Staff to prepare a contract for approval at a future board meeting, pending solicitor's concurrence. This construction will be funded 100% through Passenger Facility Charges (PFCs).
