Bids have been received and tentative award made. We anticipate the Grant Offer from the FAA within the coming week for electronic signature. We continue to expect that work will begin this year and be completed at the beginning of next construction season.

At the same time the Consultant continues to work on design for the next phase of construction which will place the fill for the taxiway extension.

ITEM 7 DIRECTOR'S REPORT: (Carl Beardsley, Executive Director)

Passenger enplanements for the month of July 2021 increased <u>114.0%</u> to <u>14,951</u> from <u>6,969</u> in the month of July 2020.

Load factors in July 2021 have increased to a very impressive <u>95%</u> overall; General Aviation saw an increase of <u>23.7%</u>: <u>1,154</u> departures in July 2021 compared to <u>933</u> in July 2020. GA revenues also increased <u>\$5,441</u> or <u>32%</u> as comparted to July 2020.

Mr. Beardsley also reported that effective September 9, 2021, American Airlines schedule to Charlotte and Chicago will be returned to prepandemic levels, and even more seats as they are using larger aircraft currently.

Additionally, United Airlines service to Washington Dulles and Chicago will also be restored to pre-pandemic levels: 2 flights to both destinations.

A. Hangar Update: Aviation Technologies

Aviation Technologies New High Tail Storage Hangar

Hangar Construction continues to progress. Material delays and design changes have pushed the completion date to the October November time frame. Most of the construction has been completed. Major items remaining are installation of the hangar's rolling door and site work.

We continue to meet weekly with FBO and their construction manager to review progress and coordinate operations and construction.

B. Employee Recognition

Mr. Beardsley recognized and thanked Airport Employees Michelle Aigeldinger (Finance) and Thomas Hughes (Maintenance) on their 15 years of service and dedication at AVP.

C. <u>TSA/DHS Mandate: Masks</u>

Mr. Beardsley reported the Mandatory Mask Mandate issued by the Department of Homeland Security has been extended until **January 18**, **2022** for all transportation networks throughout the United States, including airports, onboard commercial aircraft, over-the-road buses, and commuter bus and rail systems through January 18, 2022.
