(3) ACP 19-05 Switchgear Controller Replacement - Terminal Emergency Power

Recommend the Airport Board approve the addition to the contract between the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport and Cleveland Brothers for the Replacement of the Switchgear Controller for Terminal Building Emergency Power, pending solicitor's concurrence. This addition provides for cable and conduit installation to the new switch gear controls location and the temporary power needed during the installation of the new switchgear controls. The price for these provisions is \$54,000.00 which brings the total price for equipment, installation, services and temporary power during construction to \$262,000.00. The controller acts to automatically switch from utility power to generator power in the event of a power outage. This project is 100% airport funds and is eligible for reimbursement under the CARES Act.

B. <u>Bid Award: ACP 18-03 Taxiway B Extension (Runway 4 Approach End) - NAVAIDs</u> Relocation Project.

Bids for Construction of the "Taxiway B Extension (Runway 4 Approach End) - NAVAIDs Relocation" Project were opened on Thursday, September 1, 2022 at 2:00 P.M. in the Airport Board Room by Administration and Luzerne County Controller, Walter Griffith. Two bid packages were received and opened. After review and tabulation of the bids, the Design Consultant for the project, McFarland Johnson, Inc., provided a recommendation as to award. McFarland Johnson recommended award of the Contract in the amount of \$370,980.00 to the low bidder, Joyce Electrical Inc., Eynon, PA, (see attached). Bid tabulation is provided below:

On the Localizer Critical Area Site Preparation and ATCT Access Road construction - Work is substantially complete. The Contractor has de-mobilized most of their equipment, punch lists for work remaining have been developed. Work remains on the Tower Access Gate as we wait for delivery of materials and coordination with the FAA security contractor.

On the Taxiway B Extension Site Preparation – grant offers were received and accepted and permit approval is pending. A construction contract was prepared and approved at today's meeting. We are coordinating submissions with the Contractor as well as schedules to determine a start date for the work.

On the Localizer Relocation, bids were received and opened and award made at today's meeting. We are preparing a grant application to fund this phase of the project.

On the final phase, the taxiway paving, signing and lighting, we continue to review progress drawings.

Rehabilitate Access Road (Terminal Drive)

Design Services - KBA Engineering, p.c.

We continue to review pre-construction submissions from the Contractor including project schedule and phasing for construction. We anticipate that the construction will begin in October and be completed in the Spring of 2023.

ACP 20-02 Bag Belt Rehabilitation

Design Services - C&S Engineers
Construction - Symbrant Aviation Services

Work on the project continues. Material delivery delays have put the project behind schedule, but this has had limited effect on our use of the facility to date. In-Bound Bag Carousel #2 has been refurbished and placed back in service as work begins on Carousel #1. Final adjustments will be made to each carousel/belt after they have been in service for a period of time. The work is being phased to maintain passenger services throughout the project.

GA Hangar (Emergency Medical Response Facility)

Preliminary floor plans were reviewed by the lease tenant and some adjustments (as per their requests/comments) have been made. We are reviewing the criteria for the TIPS cooperative purchasing program membership that will allow us to work directly with a building manufacture for design and construction of the ambulance station portion of the project. We will bid for purchase of the Hangar portion and then bid for site preparation and erection of both portions of the structure onsite. We meet every other week with the consultants to review progress on the design, financing through grants, and schedule of submissions.

Mr. Beardsley reported for the month of August 2022, when compared to August 2021, passenger boardings increased 24.4%. Although load factors for August 2021 were at an astounding 94.8%, August 2022 load factors were very respectable at 85.6%. It should be noted, all of the equipment (seat availability) has since been upgraded, thus increasing seat availability by 38.3% overall.

Mr. Beardsley also noted significant increases with passengers going through TSA security in the last month, up 9.6%, as well as public parking increases, up 37.2%.
